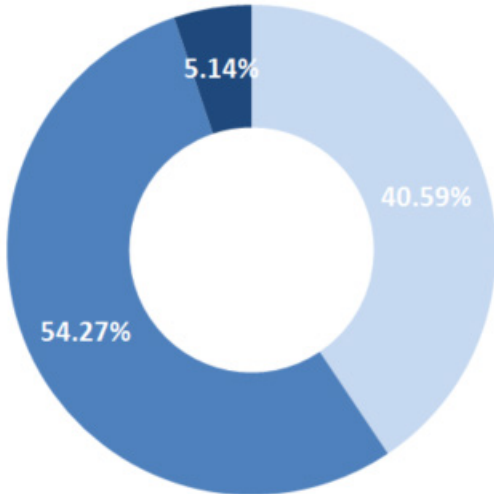

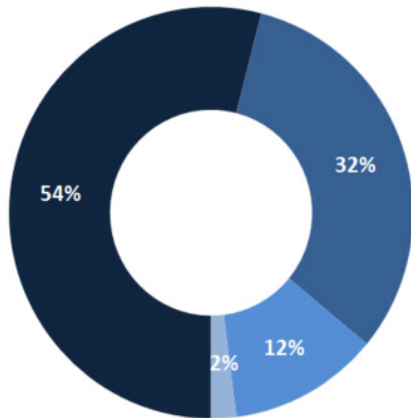

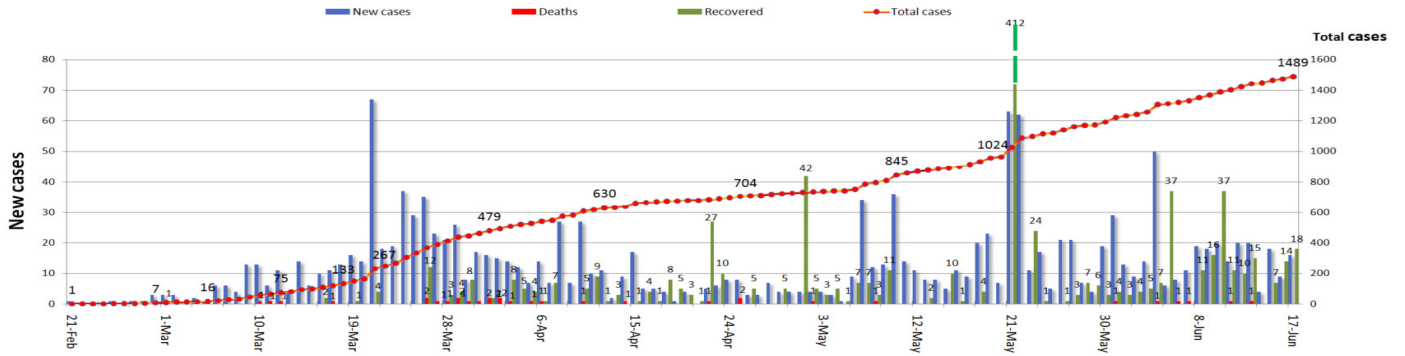

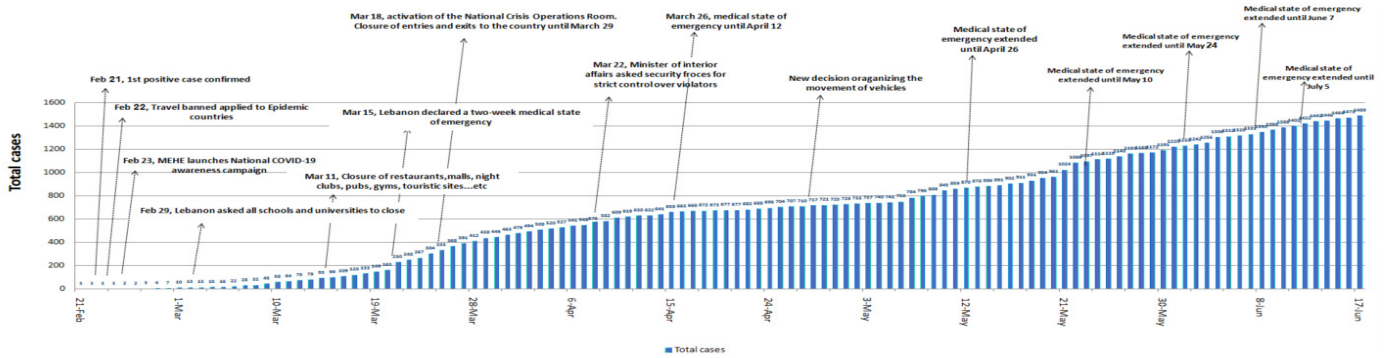

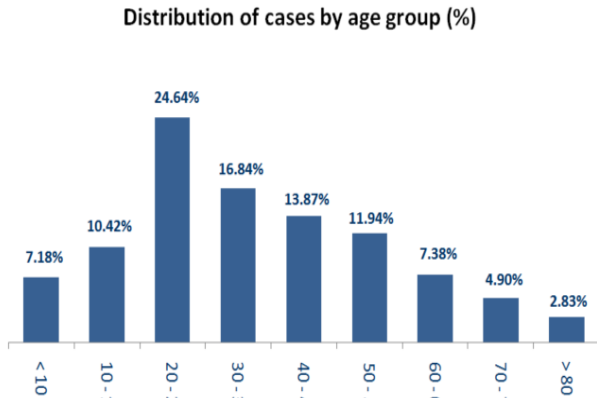
Cases per Day



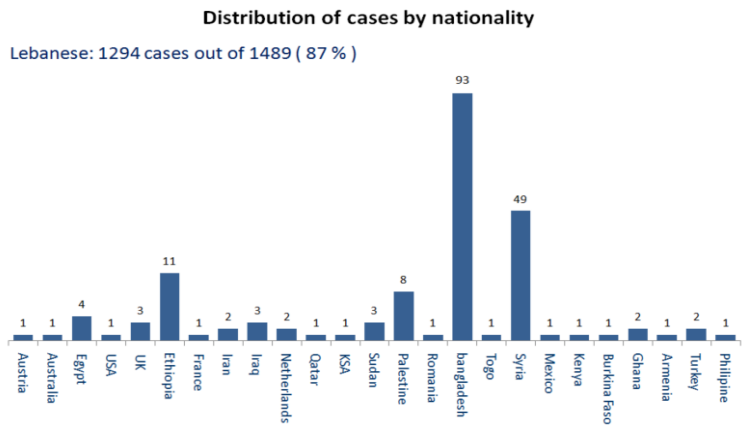
Chronology of decisions according to number of cases



Distribution of cases by age group

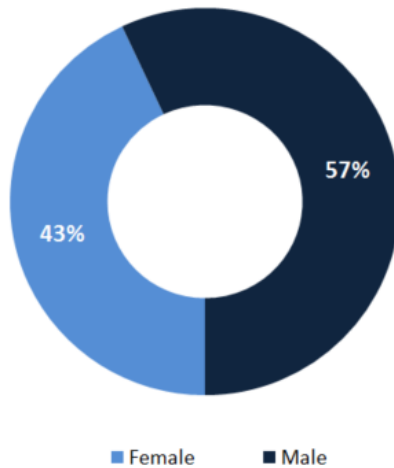


Distribution of cases by nationality

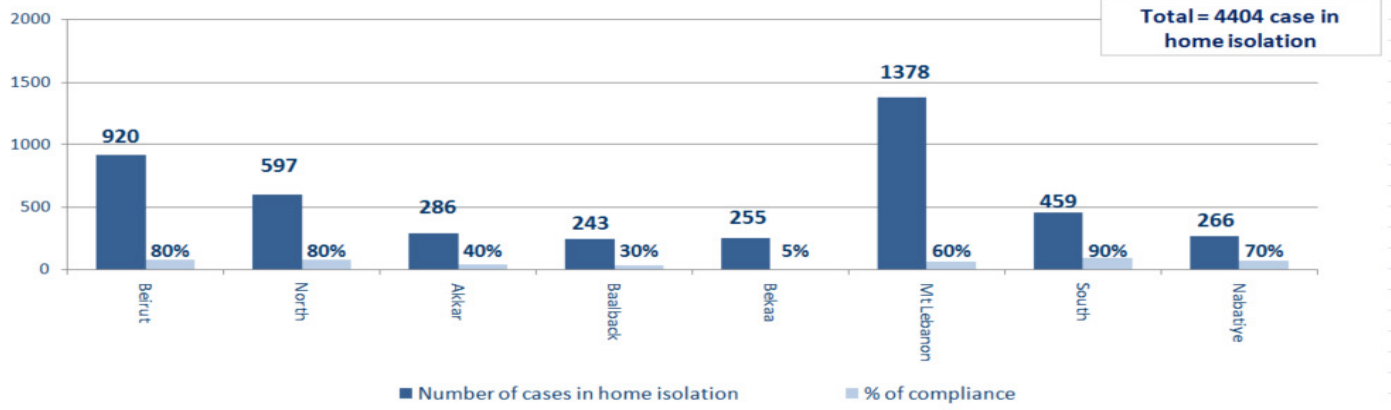


Distribution of cases by gender

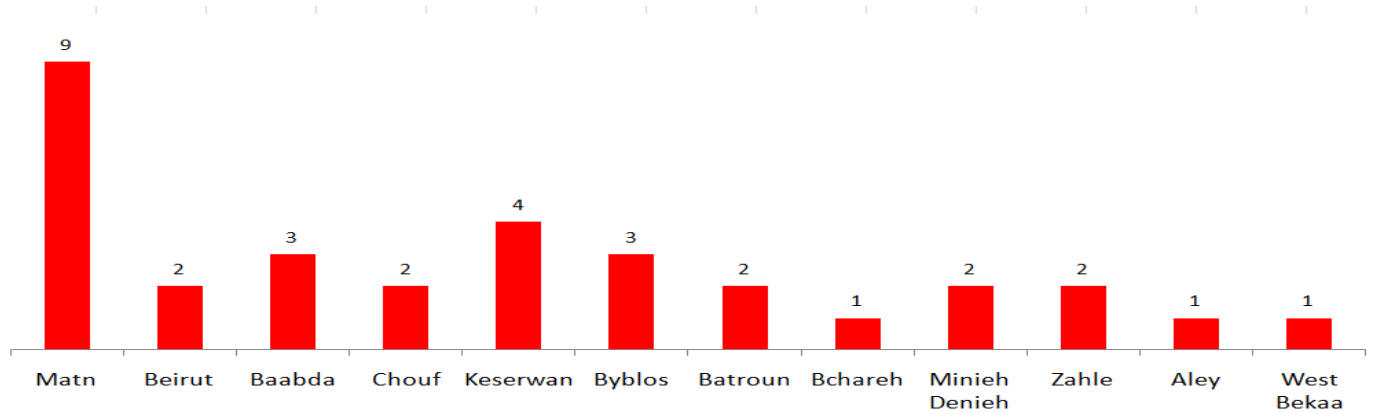
Distribution of cases by gender (%)



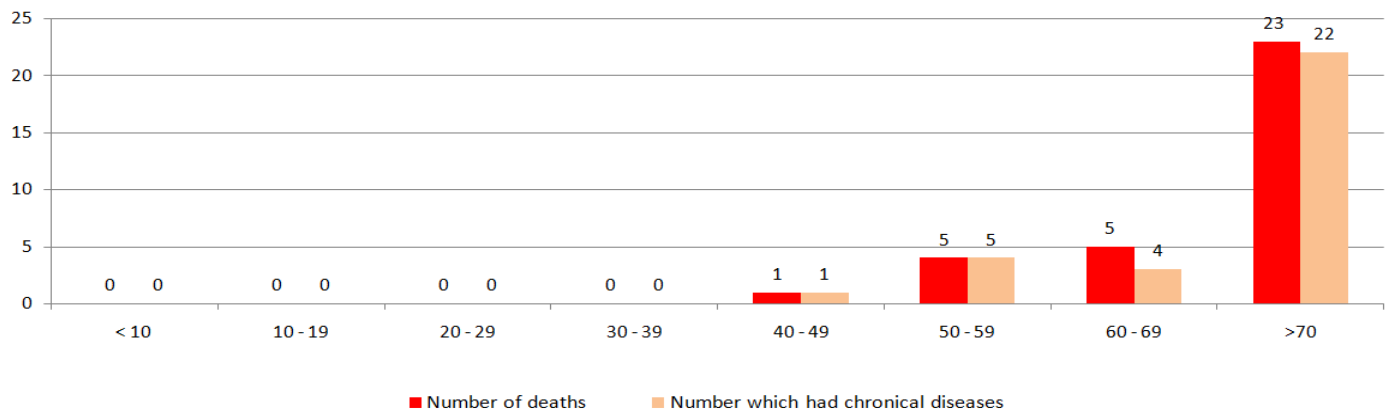
Number of individuals in home isolation and percentage of commitment to isolation



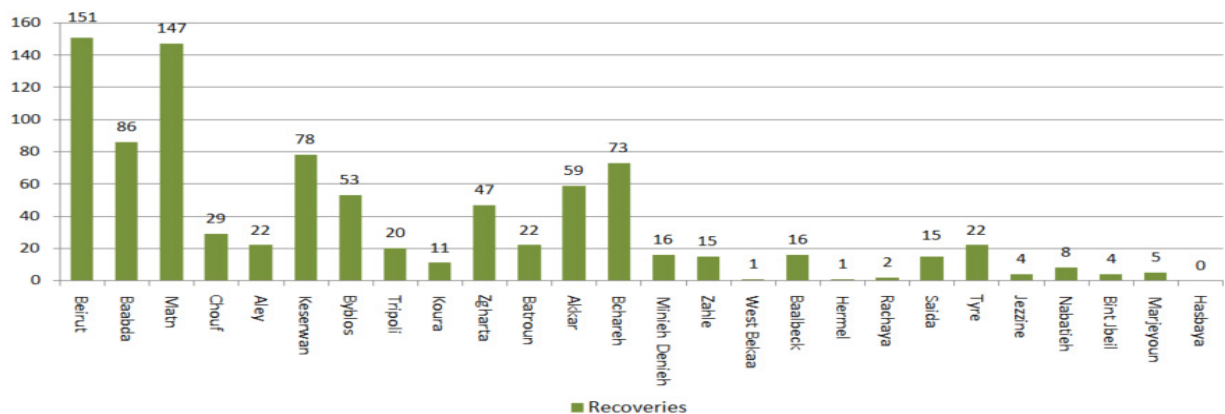
Distribution of deaths by governorates



Distribution of deaths by age



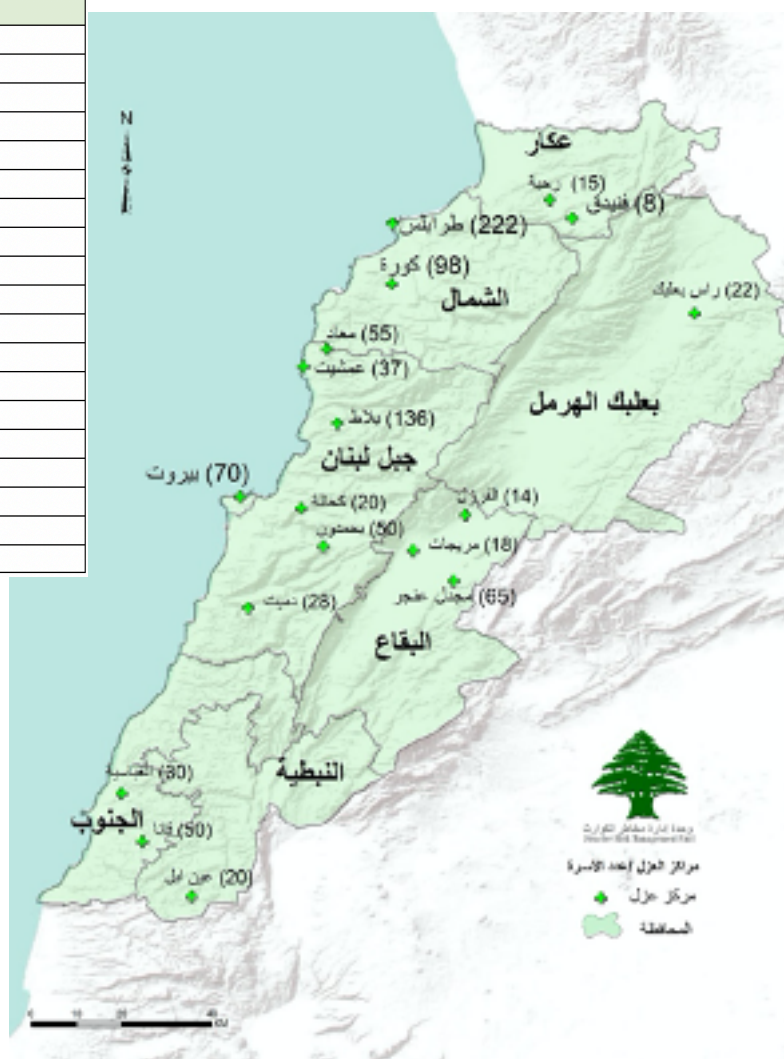
Distribution of recoveries by area



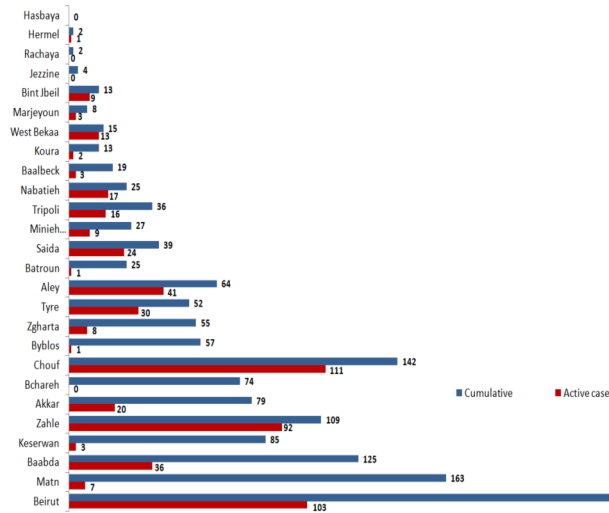
Isolation centers

- The Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures issued circular No. 452 on 15/6/2020 which included recommendations for preparing and launching quarantine centers in various Lebanese regions . The circular also evaluated the situation of migrant workers and requested that the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities gives the General Security Forces and governors the responsibility of determining locaitons in which migrant workers gather and accordingly, follow up on their situation and take the necessary actions based on the recommendations of UN agencies.
- Begin immediate work on preparing and launching the 18 isolation centers (out of 22) that were designated by the Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures and agreed on by UN agencies. The Ministry of Interior and Municipality will assign 18 managers for the 18 isolation centers, in coordination with the Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures. Additionally, UN agencies will submit a report on the level of preparedness of the 18 designated isolation centers to the Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures.

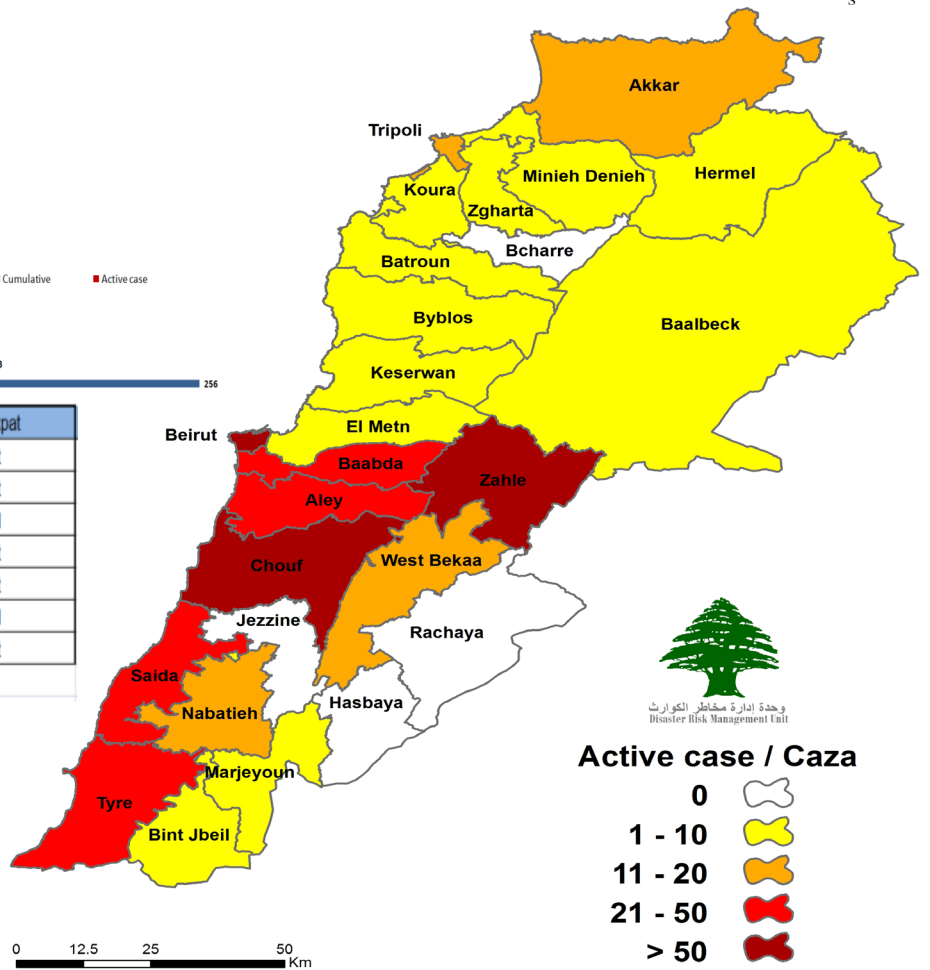

Actions Taken at the Governorate and Municipal Level

Isolation centers approved by The Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures

The committee responsible for specifying potential isolation centers includes an officer from the General Secretariat of the Supreme Council of Defense, a medical doctor in the army, an engineer from the army, and a representative from the Order of Nurses in Lebanon.

The committee aims to inspect possible isolation centers in coordination with the concerned governorates and municipalities.

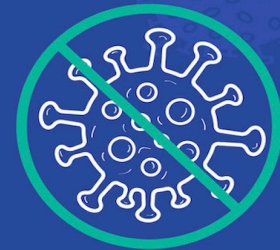
The National Committee recommended that governors and municipalities should monitor the implementation and operation of refugees' isolation centers that were approved in coordination with the Ministry of Public Health, the Ministry of Social Affairs, the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) and through following the reference manual for the management of isolation centers that have been circulated by the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities.

Examples of violations and lack of commitment

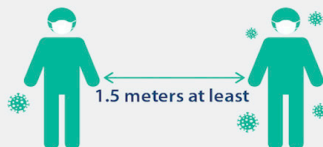
- Demonstration, and Roadblocks
- Violations of the car mobility, curfew, and the medical mask decisions
- Failure of commercial stores, supermarkets, and others to comply with the closing hours
- Overcrowding in restaurants and cafes and failure to comply with the permitted number of customers (50%)
- gatherings in front of banks, money transfer offices and ATM machines without maintaining a safe distance or putting masks
- Gathering of citizens in hiking areas without committing to preventive measures
- Non-compliance of citizens with preventive measures in food markets
- Gathering in cafes
- hookah
- gatherings on beaches and sidewalks without wearing masks.
- Opening of sports clubs and electronic and game stores
- social gatherings and celebrations
- percentage of commitment ranges between 15% to 50%

Ministry of Public Health

- The ministry is coordinating with the local authorities to determine the procedures and measures required to limit the spread of the pandemic before entering the next stage of the government's plan to reduce public mobilization, coinciding with the start of the fourth stage of the return of expatriates from 6/11/2020 to 6/19/2020
- The Ministry is visiting areas where the pandemic has spread to follow up on the implementation of isolation.
- The ministry supervises all the conducted PCR tests for those who were in contact with positive cases in various government hospitals, at the expense of the ministry in order to determine the epidemiological reality in Lebanon and take the necessary steps.
- Issued a daily report on new cases and the status of existing cases in government and private hospitals.
- Conducting and following up on conducted PCR tests for citizens in various Lebanese regions.
- Followed up on the PCR tests of citizens in different Lebanese regions and matched the results.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs

- The Ministry is coordinating with the National Committee for covid-19, the General Directorate of Civil Aviation and Middle East Airlines, to implement the fourth stage of the return of expatriates from 6/11/2020 to 19/6/2020.
- The Ministry is following up with the Lebanese missions and consulates to organize the nominal regulations for expatriate students with limited financial capabilities who will be provided with financial assistance.
- following up with foreign missions on the departure of their citizens from Lebanon
- the ministry is following up on aids and donations presented by other countries to increase Lebanon's ability to respond to coronavirus
- The Ministry is coordinating with the Ministerial Committee and with the mini-committee representing the National Committee in preparing a study on the appropriate decisions that should be taken to open the airport based on the evolution of the epidemiological curve in Lebanon and the general

mobilization procedures adopted, in addition to the experiences of other countries in this context.

Security services (Internal Security Forces, General Security, State Security, Army, General Directorate of Civil Defense)

- The army:
 - carried out patrols in different Lebanese regions to disperse gatherings
 - distributed food units (CIMIC) in different areas.
 - supported general security forces in isolating municipalities
- General Security Forces followed up on the airport's set regulations for the return of Lebanese expatriates to their homeland and tracked potential cases in various Lebanese regions and ensured that they're adhering to the terms of home isolation. In addition, they conducted patrols in different regions and issued warnings to institutions violating the decision of the council of ministers.
- ISF aided chwayfet municipality in isolating Hay Mariam and barja municipality in isolating 3 buildings.
- ISF issued a number of fines:

- The General Directorate of Civil Defense prepared 427 personnel and 69 ambulances, to interfere, when necessary, and transport those infected with the emerging coronavirus. The directorate also carried out sterilization missions in public and private areas that were excluded from the decision to close.
- State Security Forces followed up on cases in home isolations.

Ministry of Interior and Municipalities

- The Ministry issued Circular No. 9011 on 06/15/2020 discussing the mechanism for organizing appointments in mechanical centers in order to avoid gatherings. the organization process will follow the instructions specified in circular No. 57 / 2020, which states that cars with an odd number can visit clinics on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and cars with an even number can visit clinics on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
- The Ministry issued circular No. 57 / 2020 on 14/6/2020 which amends the opening and closing hours of industrial and commercial establishments. all private institutions can now open in their official working hours while applying precautionary measures. the decision restricts amusement parks and Public gardens, children's play centers, nightclubs, games centers, theaters, cinemas, and social halls from opening. the curfew decision remains intact from 12 am to 5 am.
- Implemented the extension of the general mobilization procedures according to the decision of the Council of Ministers. the general mobilization extension begins on 8/6/2020 and will remain active until 5/7/2020.

Railways and joint transportation

Borders and Airport

-Transporting those arriving to Lebanon via Rafic Hariri International Airport or Syrian borders to the isolation centers in coordination with the Ministry of Public Health and security forces (25 buses)

Notes:

- The airport: All arrivals through Rafic Hariri International Airport are subject to health and security measures approved in the plan for the return of Lebanese expatriates by the Ministry of Public Health, the General Directorate of General Security and the General Directorate of Civil Aviation.
- Ports: Before allowing any vessel to enter the campus's harbor, the entire crew of the vessel is examined by a device approved by the Ministry of Public Health to ensure that there are no infections.
