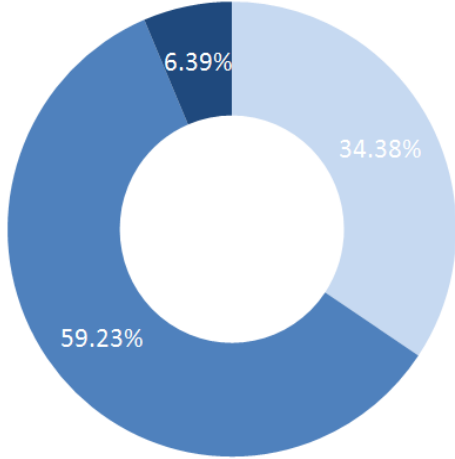

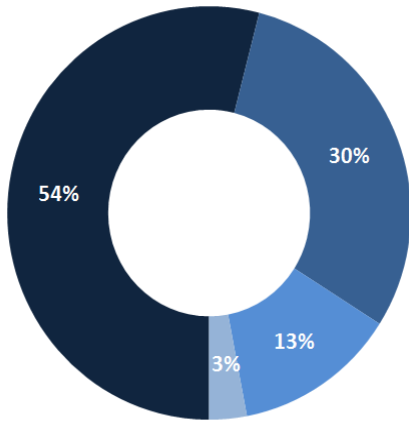

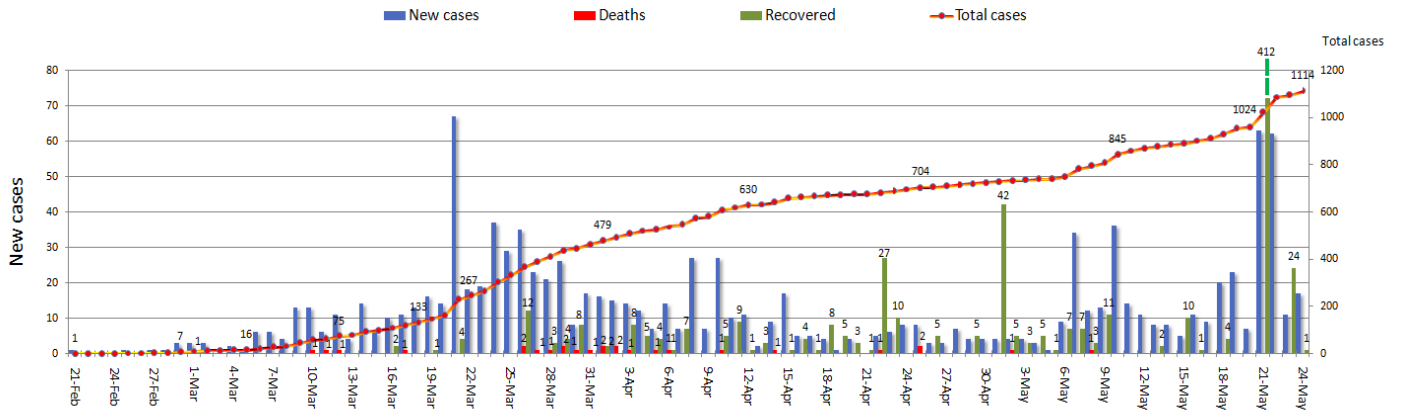

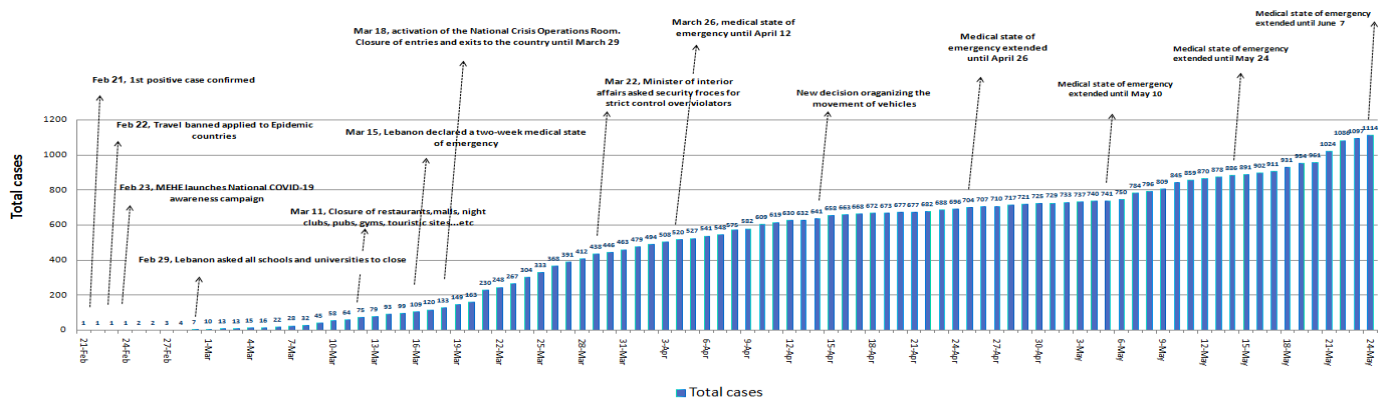

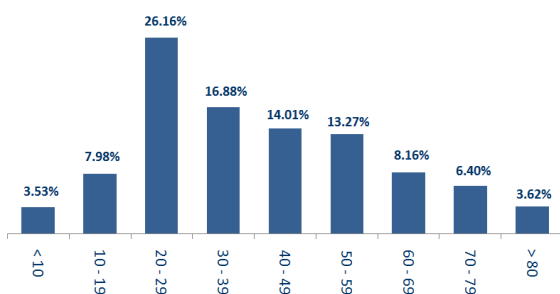
Cases per Day



Chronology of decisions according to number of cases

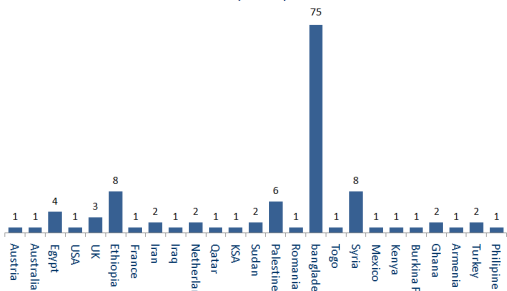


Distribution of cases by age group (%)

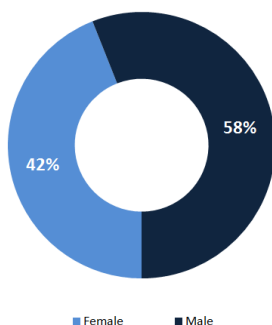


Distribution of cases by nationality

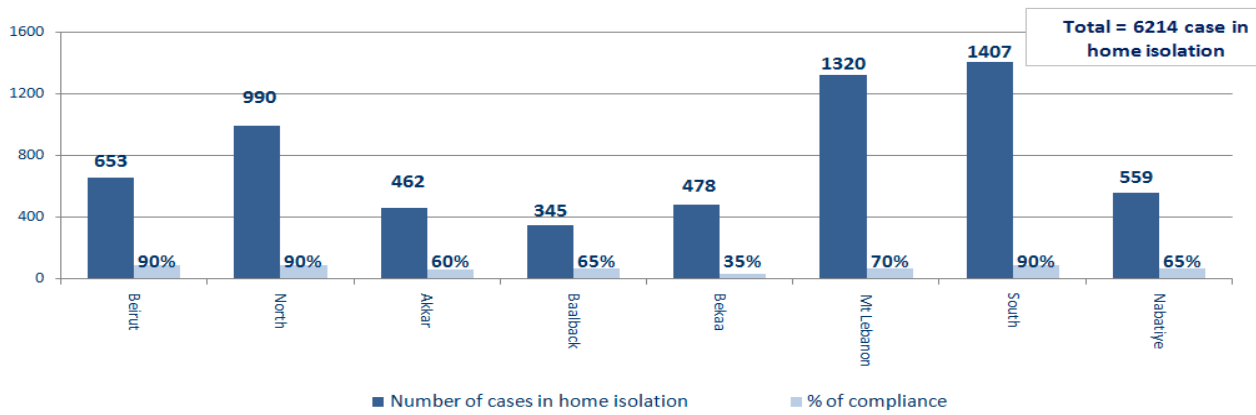


Distribution of cases by gender (%)

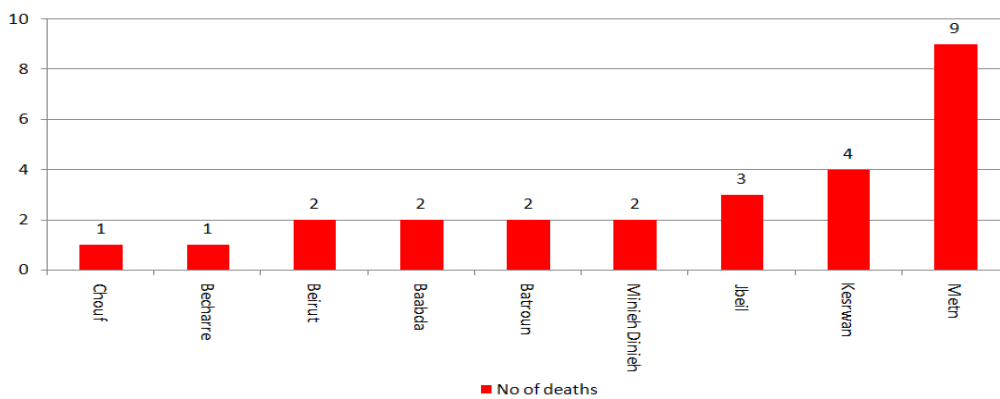

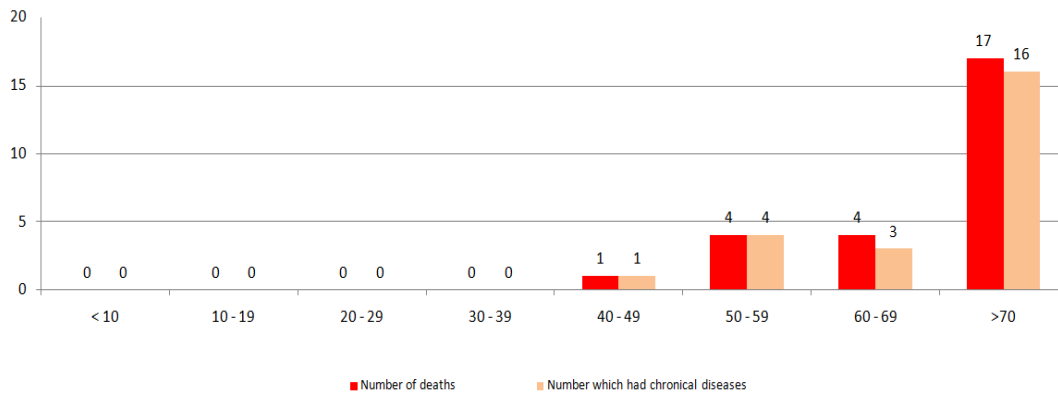
Number of individuals in home isolation and percentage of commitment to isolation



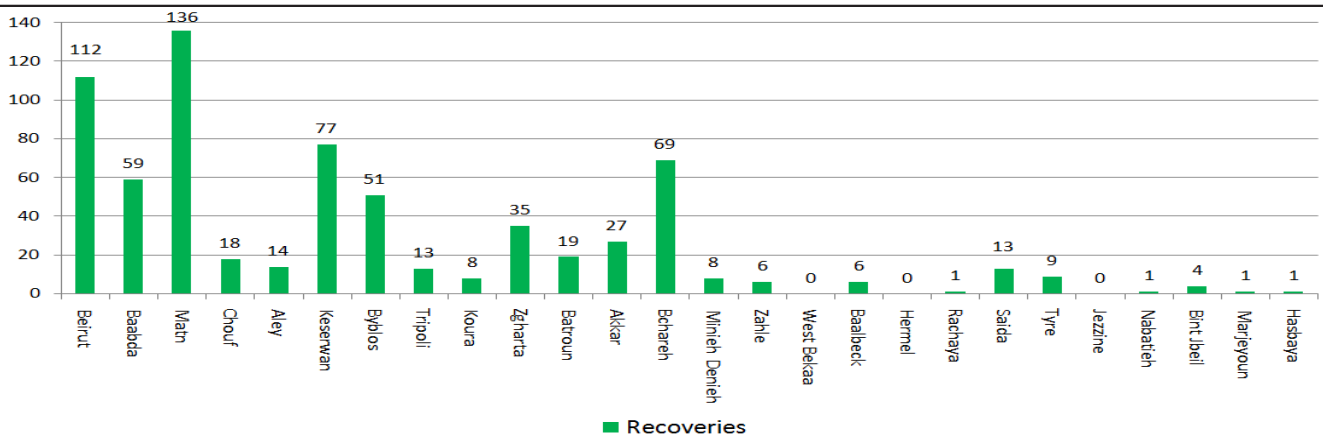
Distribution of deaths by governorates



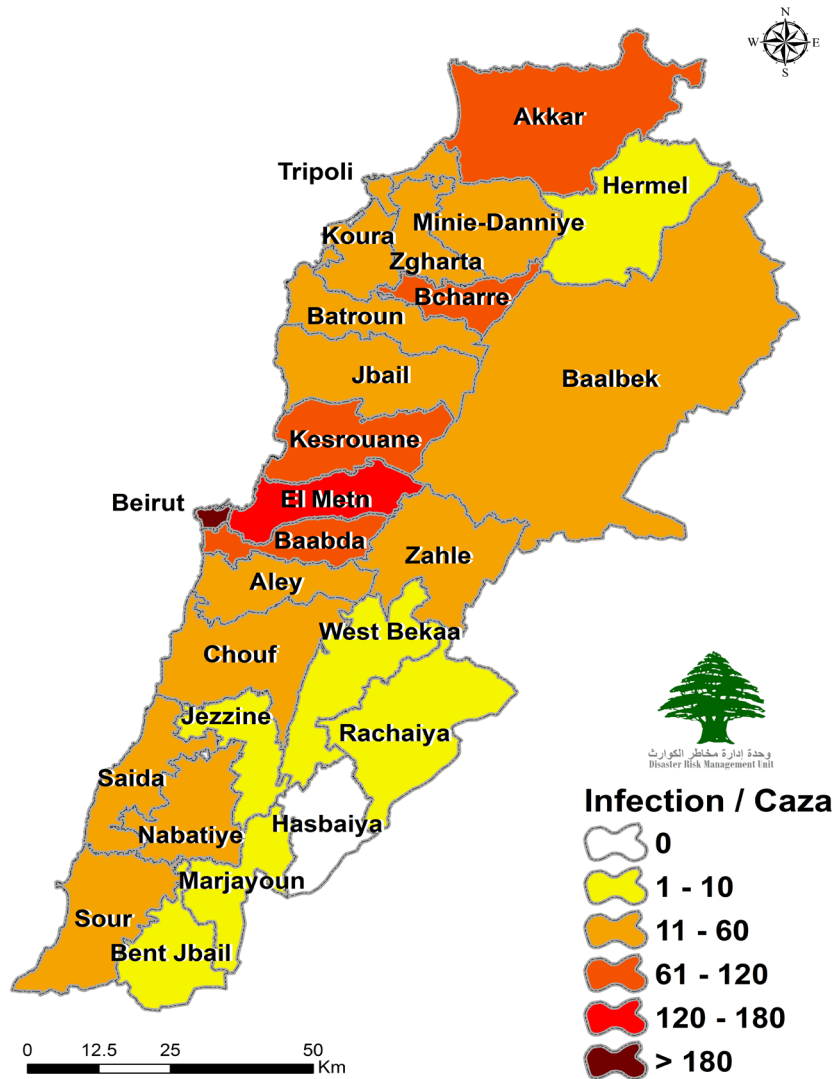
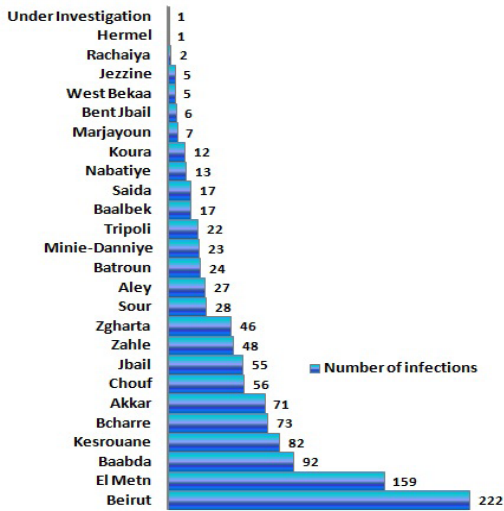
Distribution of deaths by age

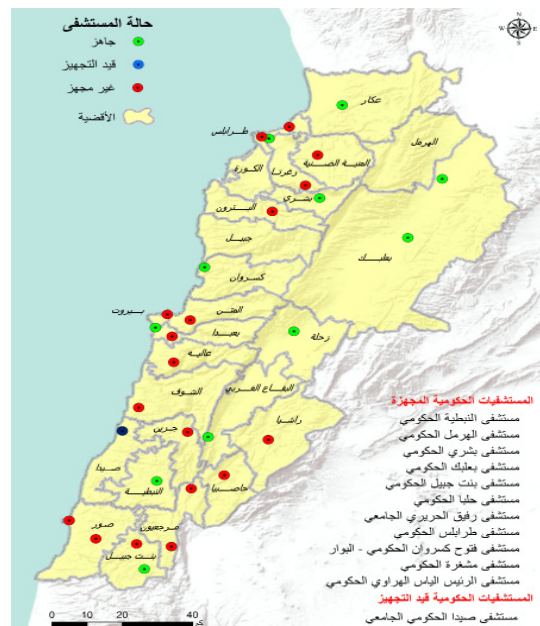

Actions Taken at the Governorate and Municipal Level

Isolation centers approved by The Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures

Thursday, April 30, 2020

The committee responsible for specifying potential isolation centers includes an officer from the General Secretariat of the Supreme Council of Defense, a medical doctor in the army, an engineer from the army, and a representative from the Order of Nurses in Lebanon.

The committee aims to inspect possible isolation centers in coordination with the concerned governorates and municipalities.

The National Committee recommended that governors and municipalities should monitor the implementation and operation of refugees' isolation centers that were approved in coordination with the Ministry of Public Health, the Ministry of Social Affairs, the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) and through following the reference manual for the management of isolation centers that have been circulated by the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities.

Ministry of Public Health

- Implementing a wide campaign in various Lebanese regions to examine those who have been in contact with other cases in aim of updating the epidemiological curve.
- Issued a daily report on new cases and the status of existing cases in government and private hospitals.
- Implemented the health measures agreed upon within the Lebanese government's plan to return Lebanese expatriates during flights and at the airport, and defined the required isolation procedures according to the health status of expatriates in coordination with the Committee for the Follow up on Coronavirus Preventive Measures and Procedures, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Public Works and Transport, the General Directorate of Public Security and Middle East Airlines.
- Following up on the health situation of expatriates who have returned to Lebanon.
- Conducting and following up on conducted PCR tests for citizens in various Lebanese regions.
- The Ministry of Public Health has started increasing the number of PCR examinations and distributing medical supplies to government hospitals as part of its plan that focuses on random sampling every day in various Lebanese regions, which will allow to define the epidemic stage and take appropriate decisions.
- Follow-uped up on the PCR tests of citizens in different Lebanese regions and matched the results.
- Received medical assistance from other countries to increase the capacity of hospitals and medical personnel.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs

- The ministry was informed that several expatriates donated money to governmental hospitals and the medical staff.
- The Ministry is following up with the Lebanese missions and consulates to organize the nominal regulations for expatriate students with limited financial capabilities who will be

provided with financial assistance.

- The Ministry is coordinating with banks and BDL to transfer money for students abroad
- following up with foreign missions on the departure of their citizens from Lebanon
- the ministry is following up on aids and donations presented by other countries to increase Lebanon's ability to respond to coronavirus

Security services (Internal Security Forces, General Security, State Security, Army, General Directorate of Civil Defense)

- The army:
 - carried out patrols in various Lebanese regions to ensure the closure of all cafes, shops and factories, and the commitment of the exempted institutions to the permissible working times. army also closed a number of cafes and commercial stores
 - Implemented circumstantial barriers and prevented citizens from moving on roads from 18:00 until 5:00, with the exception of those permitted to do otherwise.
 - Organized crowds in front of ATMs, and dispersed gatherings.
 - Reported the closure of 39 roads in different regions.
 - Supported the municipalities in closing the violating stores, taking the citizens' temperature and sterilizing the cars.
 - Distributing social assistance to the poorest families, as part of the social emergency plan approved by the Lebanese government.
- General Security Forces followed up on the airport's set regulations for the return of Lebanese expatriates to their homeland and tracked potential cases in various Lebanese regions and ensured that they're adhering to the terms of home isolation. In addition, they dispersed several gatherings and aided several municipalities in issuing several written warnings to institutions and individuals that did not adhere to the decisions of the Council of Ministers.
- ISF issued 540 fines, 417 were directed at cars that violated the car plate mobility decision and 116 were directed at individuals who violated the public mobilization decision and 7 to institutions.
- ISF supported the municipalities in isolating the towns where the virus has spread significantly during the past 24 hours, especially in Mazboud (Chouf), Majdal Anjar (Zahle) and Ras al-Nabeh (Beirut) in cooperation with the army brigades deployed in the regions
- The General Directorate of Civil Defense carried out 4 transportation missions for dialysis patients to hospitals based on the Minister of Interior and Municipalities Decision No. 479/2020. It also prepared 427 personnel and 67 ambulances, to interfere, when necessary, and transport those infected with the emerging coronavirus. The directorate also carried out sterilization missions in public and private areas that were excluded from the decision to close.
- State Security Forces visited different Lebanese regions and issued fines for a number of shops. The forces also issued a number of warnings and followed up on cases in home isolations.

Ministry of Interior and Municipalities

- The Ministry issued Circular No. 7473 on 05/22 directed to Qaqqaminqin which emphasizes that municipalities should prevent any sports or recreational gatherings or amusement

parks and sports clubs and stadiums and parks.

- The Ministry issued Memorandum No. 51 on 17-05-2020 determining the opening and closing times of institutions, the mobility hours and the groups excluded from the decisions of the Council of Ministers.
- The Ministry issued Circular No. 582 on 12/5/2020 based on Cabinet Resolution No. 2 of 12/5/2020 regarding the closure of all private institutions, markets, commercial stores, educational sector, banks and others for a period of four days starting from 19:00 on Wednesday May 13 until 5am on Monday May 18. the decision excludes some institutions and prohibits daily wandering between six in the evening and five in the morning.
- Implemented the extension of the general mobilization procedures according to the decision of the Council of Ministers that was issued on 5/5/2020 and that will remain active until 24/5/2020.
- The Ministry issued Memorandum No. 48 on 2/5/2020 regarding the implementation of the second stage of opening institutions according to the decision of the Council of Ministers, which started on Monday 4/4/2020. the memo specified the opening hours for restaurants, provided that the percentage of customers does not exceed 30%, Barbers, car showrooms and car dealerships, with an emphasis on adhering to safety standards and the necessary preventive measures.
- The Ministry issued the instructions for the electronic joint platform for municipalities (IMPACT) for evaluation, coordination and follow-up in order to facilitate the follow-up of health, social and security issues resulting from the coronavirus outbreak. The project is a partnership between the ministries of the Interior and Municipalities, Public Health, and Social Affairs and with the National Operations Room <https://cp.interior.gov.lb>
- Issued circular No. 6476 on 4/5/2020 specifying the need of sharing the name of the responsible municipality or the Union of Municipalities without mentioning any member's name when sharing food vouchers and food boxes.

Railways and joint transportation
Borders and Airport
The Authority is responsible for transporting those arriving to Lebanon via Rafic Hariri International Airport to the isolation centers via 25 buses

- The airport: All arrivals through Rafic Hariri International Airport are subject to health and security measures approved in the plan for the return of Lebanese expatriates by the Ministry of Public Health, the General Directorate of General Security and the General Directorate of Civil Aviation.
- Ports: Before allowing any vessel to enter the campus's harbor, the entire crew of the vessel is examined by a device approved by the Ministry of Public Health to ensure that there are no infections.

Objectives of the National Operations Room

The National Operations Room works on coordinating efforts in order to accomplish the following goals:

- First Objective: Control the spread of the virus through the application of precautionary measures, minimize direct contact among people, and increase awareness of the population and access to information.
- Second Objective: Ensure the continuity of services at the national level and adopt and encourage remote working.
- Third Objective: Increase health sector capacity by continuously assessing available resources, gaps and look for funding and technical assistance to build up capacities and case management.

General Directions and Recommendations

- Implement the decisions issued by the Presidency of the Council of Ministers at the level of public and private institutions and municipalities.
- Stay at home and don't go out unless it is necessary.
- Frequently wash hands and follow all safety measures set by the Ministry of Public Health.
- Avoid crowded places and social contact and commit to a safe distance between individuals.
- Seek medical care if you feel fever, cough and difficulty of breathes. Call the Ministry of Public Health hotline 1214 or 01-594459

Risks that Might Result in the Rapid Spread of the Virus

- Lack of adherence to the medical advisories.
- Disrespecting to compulsory home quarantine.
- The spread of the virus in crowded places.
- Allowing gatherings to take place
